Type of document : Report on the kind of document it is (diary? personal letter? legal document?).	Secondary historical account; a scholarly text	The title states is covers a period from 1821-1869, but is was published in 1957.
Purpose : Report everything you can about the likely reason for creating the document.	To provide a scholarly account of the events impacting the HBC	<i>Opinions are supported with historical evidence</i>
Credibility: Report everything you can about whether the information in the document is reliable or not.	Seems very reliable; the author is a university professor and is especially known for his work in this area. Offers specific comments supported with evidence	Is called "a pre-eminent scholar" Refers to primary source documents such as Gladstone's remarks and a select committee of Parliament. Written long after the event when an overview of many factors would be known.
